## SJMS Centennial Planning Starts

St. John's Military School will celebrate the 100th year of its establishment during the 1987-88 school year. Preliminary plans for the Centennial are beginning to be formulated according to Col. Keith G. Duckers, School President.

The SJMS Board of Trustees has directed the president to appoint a Centennial committee.

While no appointments have yet been made, Col. Duckers states "that committee members will represent all areas of school life including Cadets, faculty, parents, trustees, alumni, the St. John's Foundation, the Salina Community, former teachers and others."

Tentative plans are for the Centennial year to begin with

Commencement, May 1987. Seniors in the 99th Corps will be graduated that spring.

The year-long celebration will culminate with the graduation of the 100th Corps, May 1988.

Col. Duckers says he plans to meet with a Centennial Steering committee early next year to make plans.

Scholarship recipients will be required to make an early commitment to return for the 1984-85 school year.

All scholarships will be awarded prior to the cut-off date for early re-enrollment, April 15.

## Foundation Endorses Chapel Renovation
