

# Washington - New York City On Agenda For St. John's Spring Trip

Plans for the annual historical and educational tour to Washington D. C., Mt. Vernon, Annapolis and New York City have been completed for this year's trip.

The week-long trip will begin at 6:40 p.m., Friday, March 25. The group will leave Salina at that time and will arrive in St. Louis Saturday morning, March 26 where the Cadets will board the Baltimore and Ohio Railroads "National Limited" for the trip to Washington.

## Will Attend Services

Before attending church services at the Episcopal Cathedral, the group will go on a sightseeing tour of Washington including the Embassies and Legations of foreign countries and

the Islamic Center, Sunday, March 27.

Following lunch, the cadets will see the changing of the guard at the Tombs of the Unknown Soldiers at Arlington National Cemetery. They will also visit Alexandria, Va., and Mt. Vernon, home of George Washington.

Tours of the Bureau of Printing and Engraving, Washington Monument, Lincoln Memorial, the Capitol Building, the Congressional Library and a luncheon with Senator Frank Carlson of Kansas will be the highlights of Monday, March 28. The group will leave Washington at 4 pm for the drive to New York City.

## Visit U. N.

A tour of the United Nations building and the attendance at a committee session of the UN will be the highlights of the trip on Tuesday, March 29. The afternoon will be spent seeing New York City by bus with stops at the Cathedral of St. John the Divine and Chinatown. During this tour the Cadets will also see Wall Street, the Battery, Times Square, Central Park and the Steamer Piers.

The evening entertainment will feature a visit to NBC Radio and Television studios for a guided tour to be followed by a visit to the Observation Room of the RCA Building in Rockefeller Center.

## To Tour Academy

The group will visit the United States Naval Academy at Annapolis on Wednesday March 20 and will leave for Salina at 5 pm that evening.

The trip will come to an end with the group's arrival back in Salina at 12:40 am, Friday, April 1.

Reservations for the trip must be made by Feb. 15 with Maj. Keith G. Duckers, assistant superintendent. The list of boys with parental consent will be reviewed by a faculty committee shortly before the trip. Approval to make the trip will then be given according to academic standing.

## New N.H.S. Qualifications

A change in the qualifications for membership in the St. John's chapter of National Honor Society has been adopted upon the recommendation of Mrs. A. Y. Hardy, club sponsor, and Lt. Cmdr. H. E. Nuss, senior master.

The varsity bowed to Enterprise in a thriller 45-44, while the "B" squad dropped a 20-18 decision to the Bulldogs.

Brookville's Cardinals whacked the varsity 66-30 and the "B" team 46-40.

Woodbine rolled past the Cadets 65-46 and Assaria's Tro-

jans roared to a 65-20 win. The Assaria "B" beat the Cadet junior varsity by a 55-22 score.

In the Enterprise game Bill Wright paced the Cadets with 18 points. He was followed by Chuck Twenhofel with 11, John Wilson with six, Herb Jacob with five and Al Short with four.

Leading the Cadet "B" against Enterprise were Jim Howden and Tom Banes with seven points each. Jim Dumm canned four and Hank Brandes contributed a free toss.

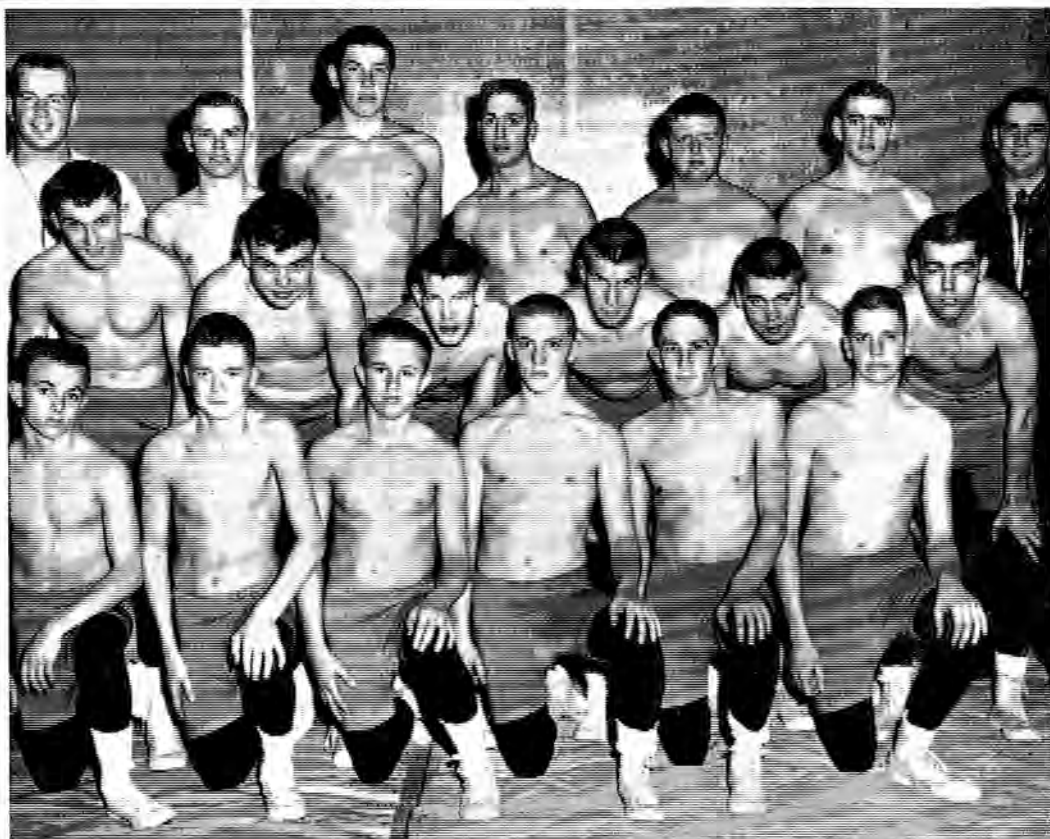
