## Nebraska Trip A Success

### Upper School Cadets Visit Offutt A.F.B., Cornhusker Capitol

All Cadets in the St. John's Upper School made a three day educational trip to Omaha and Lincoln, Nebraska during the semester break, Jan. 12 to 14.

The trip was made in four buses furnished by the Air Force and the Kansas National Guard.

The group left at 6:30 a.m. Jan. 12. The Crack Squad drilled at Wetmore high school at 10:30 a.m. A chicken dinner was served to the entire group at the Wetmore Methodist Church.

The group arrived in Omaha Friday afternoon and were taken on a tour of Offutt Air Base, the Strategic Air Command headquarters. The Cadets were housed at the Alert Barracks at Offutt Friday night.

Two Nike-Hercules sites in the Omaha-Lincoln area were visited Saturday morning. The Cadets toured the Nebraska state capitol and were greeted by Governor Frank Morrison, a member of the St. John's board of trustees. Governor Morrison's two sons are former Cadets.

The Cadets attended the Nebraska University - Colorado University basketball game in the Coliseum that evening. The Crack drill squad performed at the half.

The group left Lincoln at 11 a.m. Sunday.

## Colonel Hardy Passed Away Dec. 11

Lt. Col. Aaron Young Hardy (US Army, Ret.), 71, Professor of Military Science at St. John's Military School and a grandson of the famed Mormon leader Brigham Young, died Dec. 11, at his home on the campus.

Death was attributed to a heart attack.

Colonel Hardy had been on the St. John's staff since 1951 and became professor of military science two years ago. He was also coach of the Rifle team and traveled for the school in the New Mexico-Colorado area during the summers.

He began his military career with the Signal corps of the Utah National Guard and later served in the cavalry and the field artillery in the United States and Hawaii.

From 1942 until 1951, when he came to St. John's, he was superintendent of the Colorado Military School. He was one

of the founders of the National Defense Cadet Corps Association.

He was born May 14, 1890, in Salt Lake City, Utah, the son of one of the 47 children of Brigham Young, the Mormon leader who led his people from Illinois to Utah.

Young died in 1877, 13 years before Colonel Hardy was born. Colonel Hardy was a member of the Mormon Church.

Among the survivors are his wife, Annabel, head of the St. John's English department.

The funeral services were held in Denver. Pall bearers were Cadets from St. John's. They included John Talley,

His greatest joy was working with boys, in helping them to better understand themselves and better to serve themselves and others.

His memory will live on in the lives of the many thousands of boys he served so unselfishly.

The fact that his life was an influence cannot be denied.

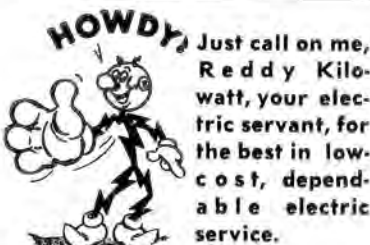

John Hjorth, junior Cadet from Overland Park, Kas., placed in several swimming events at an Invitational Swimming meet held at West Point during the Christmas Holidays.

Hjorth, representing the West Brook Country Club, won first place in the 100-yard back stroke and first in diving from the one meter board. He placed second in the 100-yard, and 50-yard freestyle event.

The Cadet swimmer has also participated in the 400-yard medal relay and the 100-yard relays. He says occasionally he will swim the 220-yard individual relay which consists of the back stroke, freestyle, breast stroke and butterfly stroke.

Occasionally Hjorth will swim a long distance. This past summer he said he swam a 10-mile distance in a 25-yard long pool.

His ultimate goal is to be able to compete in the next Olympics.

## Cadets Fire .22 Caliber Qualifying Scores
