Furlough Starts Next Friday

The first long vacation will begin at 10:30 a.m. Friday, December 15, to permit Cadets to spend the Christmas holidays with parents and friends.

Classes will be dismissed early on Friday to permit Cadets to board the west-bound Portland Rose at 11:11 a.m. Cadets are to report in by 7 p.m. Tuesday, Jan. 2. A school bus will meet the east-bound Portland Rose at the end of furlough. A faculty representative will also be on the train on both trips.

Col. R. L. Clem, school rector, said Cadets may leave any time their parents' request but will be given a zero for every class missed prior to the start of furlough.

Cadets are not permitted to stay on campus after midnight on Dec. 15.

Dr. Kenneth McFarland, safety spokesman, said, "If our American system goes down, it will not be because of the atomic bomb. It will fail because we have developed a philosophy that the individual is no longer responsible for his own physical, financial and moral well-being. The traffic safety problem is part of this larger problem—the problem of each individual accepting the moral responsibility for his own well being."
