Large Crowd Expected for Thanksgiving

Two-Day Holiday Features Military Ball, Turkey Dinner

Two days of festivities will be the highlight of the Thanksgiving season at St. John's Military School. More than 600 parents, friends, Cadets and other relatives are expected to take part.

Classes will not be held Wednesday, Nov. 22, allowing time for Cadets to spend with parents and friends. Overnight passes are not granted, said Col. R. L. Clem, school rector.

The traditional Military Ball will begin with the faculty receiving line at 7:30 pm Wednesday at the 4-H Building in Kenwood Park.

The first appearance of the 1961-62 Crack Squad under the command of 2nd Lt. Richard Mattix will be at 8 pm. Dancing will be from 8:30 to 11:30 pm.

A service of Holy Communion will be celebrated at 7:15 a.m. Thursday Nov. 23 in Armstrong Memorial Chapel on campus. The Foundation breakfast will be held at 8:30 a.m. The first meeting of that group for the current year will be held following breakfast.

A service of Thanksgiving will be held at 11:15 a.m. in Christ Episcopal Cathedral in downtown Salina. The Rev. David T. Agnew, vicar of the Church of the Incarnation in Salina and father of Cadet Cpl. Tom Agnew, will be the preacher.

The traditional turkey dinner will be served at 12:30 p.m. in the 4-H building. The Cadets

will be free Thursday afternoon.

Classes will resume on schedule Friday, Nov. 24.

During the Thanksgiving activities, the Denver chapter of the St. John's Foundation will sponsor a hospitality room at the Holiday Inn. Taxi service will be available.

PSAT Tests Are Taken

The PSAT scores are parallel to the College Board's standard admissions test scale, said LCDR H. E. Nuss, senior master. It enables secondary school counselors to relate PSAT scores to information concerning known college admission standards, he added.

"The main purpose of the PSAT is to provide secondary schools with a valid, reliable and inexpensive instrument for use in college guidance," he pointed out.

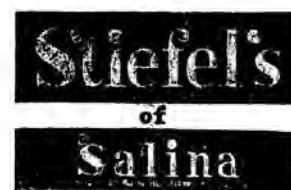

Elias Majdalani Appreciates Opportunities At St. John's

An appreciation of the things Americans take for granted is expressed by Elias Madjalani, St. John's Cadet from Beirut, Lebanon.

Attending St. John's on a scholarship, Elias feels that Americans perhaps do not appreciate the wonderful educational opportunities available to them.

The story of how Elias came to St. John's is long and has covered a number of years.

In 1948, Elias and his family were forced to leave Palestine when it was resettled by the Jews. They left behind a home, all their possessions and his father's job.

His father had no trade and found it difficult to find jobs. Those he found paid very low salaries. He had been a policeman in Palestine. But work had to be found to support his wife, Elias and Elias' two younger brothers and a sister.

Elias began to study in the public schools in Beirut which are taught in the French manner as Lebanon was once a French colony. In 1956, he began to study in English at the Joint Christian Community School for Palestine refugees.

In 1958, Elias was forced to quit school in order to help support his family. He began working for an Episcopal priest. There he met Dr. Homer B. Reed, of the staff at Ft. Hays State College, Hays, Kansas. Dr. Reed was lecturing at the University of Istanbul.

Elias asked him to help him come to the United States. Dr.

Reed began a correspondence with Col. R. L. Clem which ultimately resulted in Elias attending St. John's.

Before leaving for the States, Elias was working as a short-hand typist for a contracting and trading company.

Borrowed money purchased the air plane ticket to provide transportation to Salina. He arrived here at 12 noon, Aug. 17.

Elias said he had a very good idea of what America would be like because he had read much information provided by the U. S. Information Libraries. In no way has he been disappointed although, Elias thinks Kansas "is a strange flat state."

In regard to school, Elias said, "I enjoy the school life. I think this is the best type of school life for boys. I still see many who don't appreciate the classes as they should."

"So much is given American youth that they just don't appreciate it."

Elias is rooming with Doug White, Upper School counselor. Besides attending classes and making excellent grades, Elias also works eight hours a week for the quartermaster, Capt. Scott Haviland.

In the future, Elias hopes to be a civil engineer. "There is a demand for engineers in Lebanon and in all the Arab countries."

He said, "My parents are very happy with my progress. They are proud of my grades but are expecting better." Elias received honorable mention on the honor roll for the first grading period.
