## Testing Program Set For Mar. 9

All Upper School Cadets, except seniors, will be taking tests to evaluate abilities on Saturday, March 9.

The juniors will take the National Merit Scholarship tests which are used to select the semi-finalists in the Merit Scholarship program.

The freshmen and sophomores will take the National Educational Development tests, designed to test educational strengths and weaknesses. Lt. Cmdr. H. E. Nuss, Senior Master, said "by taking these tests in the ninth or tenth grade, a Cadet may learn about his strengths and weaknesses early enough in high school to do something about them before entering college or entering the working world."

Both testing programs evaluate English and word usage, social studies and natural sciences reading, and mathematics usage.

A \$1 fee is charged to cover materials. The results will be machine corrected and returned before the end of the school year.

## Commandant Explains Criteria For Promotions In Rank

Promotions are now being based on four criteria—academic standing, military grades, deportment and character—according to Lt. Col. James V. Ausan, Commandant — PMS.

A Cadet must meet the same academic qualifications as a varsity athlete. He must be passing in a least three subjects.

A Cadet must be passing in all military subjects and no one is promoted who fails military tests.

Colonel Ausan explained that department represents a Cadet's citizenship. It is based on the number of demerits acquired during the grading period. For promotion purposes the deportment scale must not be above 5.0.

He said, "Failure to meet any one of these qualifications makes a Cadet ineligible for promotion during that grading period."

The basis for promotions was explained recently by Colonel Ausan in an all-school assembly.

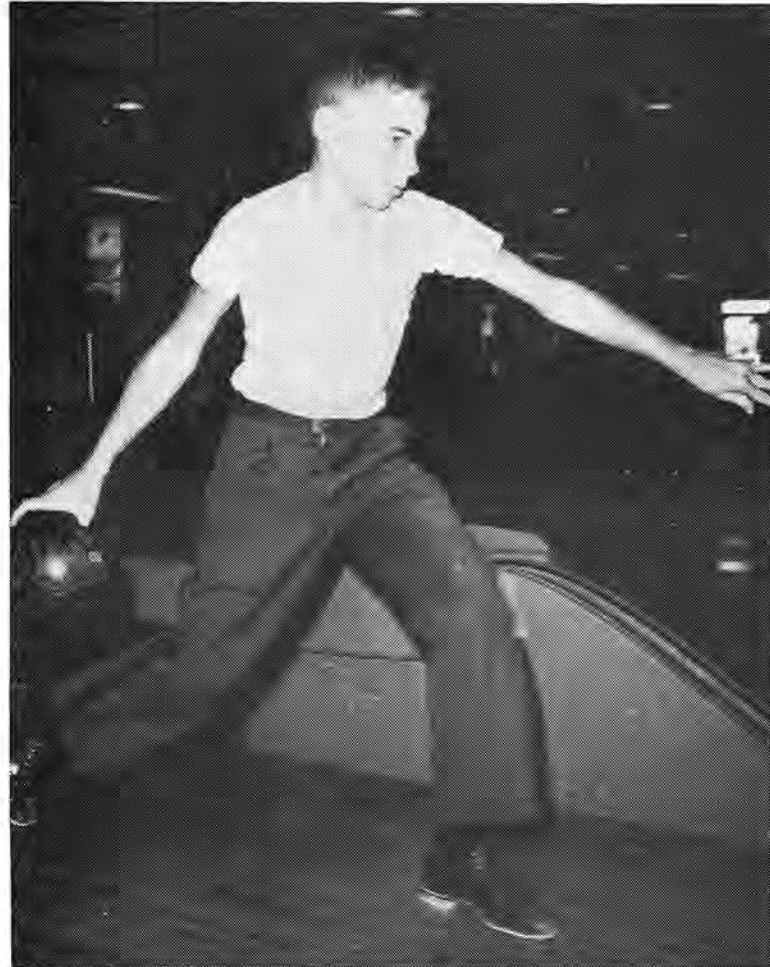

## P. S. A. T. Results Are Explained

Results of the Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude tests given by the College Board have been received and evaluated.

LCDR. H. E. Nuss, Senior Master, met and discussed the results with the 34 Juniors who took the tests in October.

In the verbal test 29 of the 34 juniors ranked above the 50th percentile nationally. Five Cadets ranked above the 90th percentile with one Cadet ranking 98th. Six Cadets ranked above the 80th percentile.

The Juniors didn't do quite as well on the mathematics test with only 17 scoring above the 50th percentile. One Cadet ranked 99th in the math section. There were five ranking between the 80th and 90th percentiles.

The results of these tests are used in connection with other school records to consider a student's qualifications for college.

# Cagers Stand 9-2 As Tourney Nears

With only one game in the regular season remaining, the St. John's basketball team is completing one of its best seasons in school history. The Cadet Cagers have won nine games while only losing two. The most recent wins have been a 62-31 decision over Kipp and a 57-41 victory over Notre Dame of Concordia.

The Cadets lost a 62-54 game to St. Teresa High of Hutchinson, a team St. John's defeated in the Cadet gym in December.

The Cagers will complete regular season play against Herington High school, Feb. 22. They will play in the Class A regional tournament at the Sacred Heart gym in Salina the first of March.

**Notre Dame of Concordia—41**

The St. John's Cadets completed their best home basketball campaign in 27 years—and possibly school history—with a 57-41 decision of Notre Dame of Concordia Feb. 7 at the school gym.

It was the fifth straight home victory.
