Clem Library Dedication Set

Open House Will Precede Dedication By Bishop Lewis

Dedication ceremonies for the Remy Leland Clem Library are being held Sunday, Sept. 30, at the school.

Members of the Board of Trustees and their wives will tour the building at 2:30 p.m. An Open House at the library from 3 to 5 p.m. will follow. More than 800 parents and friends of the school have been invited to attend. A tea will be held in the school dining hall.

The Rt. Rev. Arnold M. Lewis, bishop of the Missionary District of Western Kansas and president ex-officio of the St. John's Board of Trustees, will officiate at the short dedication service at 4 p.m. in the library reading room.

Honored guests will include Col. and Mrs. Clem; Col. Clem's 97-year-old father, Albert L. Clem of Gresham, Neb., Col. Clem's children, Dr. Alan Clem, associate professor of Government at South Dakota University, and Mrs. Ralph P. Bliss of Riverside, Calif., and five grandchildren. Major Bliss is a graduate of St. John's and is a career Army Officer. Dr. Clem also is a St. John's graduate and Gordon Prize winner.

The \$80,000 building was partially constructed with funds donated by members of the St. John's Foundation. Donors of



\$100 or more have had their names placed on a permanent plaque in the library lobby.

The library was constructed this past summer by Abbott Construction Company of Salina. Ground was broken on the project during Commencement activities in May.

The building has been furnished. The furnishings have not been paid for but it is hoped donations given during the current school year will cover this item.

Colonel Clem became superintendent of St. John's in July of 1936. He was ordained as a priest in the Episcopal church in 1941.

During his tenure as superintendent the school has experienced a continual growth. Fewer than 50 boys were in attendance during his first year here.

Colonel Clem has spear-headed a building program that has seen six buildings and residences for ten faculty families added during his administration.

Library Kept Open

The new Clem library reading room is open from 7 to 9 p.m. each evening for Cadets wishing to use these facilities.

Elias Majdalani is the library supervisor during these periods.

The library is also open on Saturday and Sunday afternoons. The hours it will be open are announced each week.

75th Corps Is Formed

Record Enrollment Of 200 Reports For Start Of Classes

St. John's Military School began its 75th year Sept. 9, with a record enrollment of 200 Cadets. This is an increase of 25 boys over the 1961-62 year.

The Cadets come from 20 states ranging from as far away as Juneau, Alaska to El Paso, Texas and from San Francisco, to Newport News, Va. Foreign students include boys from Beirut, Lebanon and Caracas, Venezuela.

Barracks facilities are at absolute capacity.

New facilities being used this fall include the new library with classrooms on the second floor and the Quartermaster store located in the basement of the Library building.

A new three-bedroom house was constructed on the east side of the campus during the summer and is the home of Lt. Col. and Mrs. James V. Ausan.

Most of the staff of last year have returned, with new faculty additions including Lt. Col. J. V. Ausan, Lt. and Mrs. Tom Starns, Lt. Richard Willis and Capt. Jim Bell. Eight faculty members now hold advanced degrees and most of the others have done work beyond the Bachelor's degree.

BOARD APPROVES ADDITION TO DINING HALL
