Recognition for academic achievements has been revised, according to LCDR. H. E. Nuss, Senior Master.

Members of the National Honor Society are awarded four coupons allowing them to miss one class period per subject during a grading period. Members may study in the activity room during scheduled study periods with the permission of the faculty officer of the day.

Each Cadet named to the honor roll or receiving honorable mention will be granted one honor pass and four coupons to miss one class per subject during a grading period.

Cadets raising their grades two points per course or a total of eight points for all subjects will be granted a special pass.

Any Cadet who raises an F to a passing grade will receive a special pass for each grade raised. If he earns an F in another course which showed a passing grade in a previous period, it will be subtracted.
