## Inspection Date Set

The annual formal general inspection of the St. John's Cadet Corps and military program, under the National Defense Cadet Corps, will be held Friday, April 26 at the school.

Cadets will spend the day displaying the knowledge they have acquired in handling military equipment assigned the school for its training program. An "Honor School" rating is the goal of every Cadet.

St. John's Military School has participated in the NRCC program for three years. The school earned an honor rating the first year. No official confirmation of the honor rating was received last year, although informal correspondence indicated the Cadet Corps was again rated tops.

Included will be various ceremonies, parades and informal guard mounts as demonstrations for the inspecting team.

School military records will be checked and all property examined.

Lt. Col. James V. Ausan, Commandant-PMS, and Maj. Arthur Long, Assistant PMS, will set the schedule for the day.

Members of the inspecting team will be Maj. Robert C. Greer, Kansas City Subsector Commander; Capt. Vancil Ranabarger, Salina Subsector, and Capt. Gilbert L. Harrod, Kansas Sector Headquarters Deputy Commander.

## Mock Battle Fought At Camp Webster

The air was filled with noises of battle as two Cadet companies attacked the counter-attacked March 9 at Camp Webster, about three miles from the school campus.

One company was the aggressor and wore Russian-style uniforms loaned by Ft. Riley.

The Aggressors left the school first and marched in platoon-squad-company formation to the camp. Arriving, the aggressive force "dug in" and arranged camouflage by piling up brush and smearing faces with mud.

The friendly forces left the school an hour later and also "dug-into" positions when they arrived.

Then the patrols, attacks and counter-attacks began. The battles sounded like the real thing because blank ammunition had been issued.

C-rations were provided for the evening meal. The Cadets slept in a large lodge at the camp and returned to the campus Sunday morning.

Lt. Col. James Ausan, Commandant-PMS, and Maj. Arthur Long, assistant PMS, directed the affair. Colonel Ausan explained that this was no "capture the flag type of game." "We stressed sound military principles."

In connection with the inspection, Walter Pettit of 16th Army Corps Headquarters will visit the school sometime between March 18 and 299 to review internal records in regard to procurement, custody and use of resources.

Furlough ends at 7.m. Sunday, March 24.

Nine busy weeks of school will remain after furlough. Events to take place will include Easter, NDCC formal inspection, Lettermen's dinner and dance and Commencement activities.
