## Thanksgiving Recess Nears!

### Large Crowd Expected For Two-Day Holiday

Many parents, relatives and friends are expected to attend the Thanksgiving Festivities at the school on Wednesday and Thursday, Nov. 27 and 28.

Classes will be dismissed on Wednesday. Faculty members will be available for conferences with parents.

Parents are invited to attend the Junior School basketball game with Bennington in the school gym at 1:30 p.m. Wednesday.

The St. John's Foundation will host a hospitality room at the Holiday Inn from 1 to 5 p.m. on Wednesday.

The traditional Thanksgiving Military Ball will begin with the faculty receiving line at 7:30 p.m. in the 4-H building in Kenwood Park. The Crack Squad will perform following the reception. The dance will be from 8:30 to 11 p.m.

A service of Holy Communion in Armstrong Chapel will open the Thursday activities at 7:15 a.m. Attendance is optional.

The annual fall meeting of the St. John's Foundation will

follow a breakfast at 8:30 a.m. at the Holiday Inn.

A Service of Thanksgiving will be at 11:15 a.m. in Christ Episcopal Cathedral in downtown Salina to be followed by the traditional turkey dinner in the 4-H building.

Cadets will be free to spend the rest of the day with their parents until taps at 9:30 p.m. The regular class schedule will resume on Friday.

Col. R. L. Clem, Superintendent and Rector, said that no overnight passes will be granted. Cadet attendance is required at the dance, the Service of Thanksgiving and the dinner.

Colonel Clem pointed out that Cadets may not drive cars unless accompanied by a parent or guardian.

Cadets will not be permitted to have visitors nor sign out on pass until 10 a.m. on Thursday.

### Additional Classrooms Available Next Year

"Six additional classrooms will probably be available on the St. John's campus beginning next September," Lt. Col. Keith G. Duckers, Assistant Superintendent, announced this week.

The Parkview public school building on the southwest corner of the campus will be taken over by St. John's when a classroom addition to Hawthorne school is completed. The Hawthorne addition, which will replace Parkview School, was started this fall. It is expected to be completed by the fall of 1964.

Parkview school was erected by the Salina Board of Education as a temporary measure on land belonging to St. John's a number of years ago.

Colonel Duckers said it is hoped the building can be used for Junior School classes when the new proposed Junior School barracks is completed.

### Fund Drive Planned

## \$300 Thousand Needed For New Junior Barracks

Plans for a capital fund drive to raise \$300,000 for a new Junior School barracks at St. John's Military School have been announced by the Board of Trustees, according to school officials.

The 88 man dormitory will be located in the vicinity of the present Junior School. The old structure will be razed when the new building is finished.

#### Kickoff on Jan. 14

A drive to raise a portion of the \$300,000 will be conducted in Salina beginning with a kick-off breakfast on Jan. 14. Trustees and friends of the school will make several hundred personal calls in Salina.

B. Hamilton Lynch, President of the Salina Board of Trade, and William W. Yost, well-known Salina insurance man, have been named co-chairmen of the drive by the Rt. Rev. Arnold M. Lewis, Bishop of the Episcopal District of Western Kansas and President Ex-officio of the board.

#### Four Phases

The drive will be divided into four phases—local, patrons, alumni and non-local friends of the school.

Cecil A. Jordan, retired milling executive from Wichita, and a trustee, will head the alumni division. His portion of the campaign is now underway with St. John's "old boys" being given an opportunity to set the pace for the drive with advance gifts and pledges.

Mr. Jordan related the importance of alumni support to the future success of St. John's. "I hope every alumnus of this school will feel it is his personal duty to participate in the drive, no matter if he can give only a few dollars a year," Mr. Jordan said that "old boys" who attended St. John's recently should have a particular awareness of the need for the new barracks.

#### Spencer Heads Patron Division

A prominent Denver patron who also serves on the Board of Trustees, John Galen Spencer, will head the patron division of the campaign. Mr. Spencer pointed out that every parent he has talked with has been in favor and supported the new barracks program.

"Friends of St. John's outside of Salina will be contacted either personally or by letter to give them an opportunity to support this important project," said Col. R. L. Clem, Superintendent and Rector.

The Board of Trustees has indicated a hope that bids may be let late next spring. Construction is expected to take a year. It is hoped the building will be ready for occupancy by September of 1965.

### NHS Sponsors Feature Movies

Full-length feature movies are being sponsored by the National Honor Society again this year.

The movies are shown in the Armstrong Chapel auditorium on Sunday afternoons. Admission is 50 cents for Upper School Cadets and 40 cents for Junior Cadets.

The first movie, "The Great Imposter", was shown Sunday, Nov. 10.
