Annual Inspection Set For April 24th

Cadets Shoot For 4th Straight Honor Rating

The annual formal general inspection of the St. John's Cadet Corps and military program by the United States Army will be held Friday, April 24.

Maj. Arthur Long Professor of Military Science, said the date was selected by 16th U. S. Army headquarters in Omaha.

Cadets will spend the day displaying the knowledge they have acquired in handling military equipment assigned the school for its training program. An "Honor School" rating is the goal of every Cadet.

St. John's Military School has participated in the National Defense Cadet Corps program for four years. The school has earned three honor rating and hopes to continue the perfect record with a fourth star this year.

Included will be various ceremonies, parades and informal guard mounts as demonstrations for the inspecting team.

School military records will be checked and all property inspected.

Capt. Jack McCandless, Commandant, and Major Long will set the day's schedule.

Members of the inspecting team will include Maj. Charles R. Kasper, St. Joseph Military Academy, Hays, and Capt. Vancil P. Ranabarger, Salina subsector.

All-Day Testing Set For Underclassmen

An all-day testing program for freshmen, sophomores, and juniors will be held March 10, according to LCDR. H. E. Nuss, Senior Master.

Freshmen and sophomores will take the National Educational Development test. Juniors will take the National Merit Scholarship test.

Tested will be English usage, mathematics, social studies reading, natural science reading and work usage.

Materials are furnished by Science Research Associates of Chicago and will be administered by members of the St. John's faculty.

Tests will be graded by SRA and results will be available in early May along with an interpretive booklet. Cost of the program is \$1 for each Cadet.

Maj. Steve Erb Primary Nominee To Naval Academy

Erb will take the scholastic aptitude test on March 7, and the physical examination on March 13. This information will be sent to the academy's admissions board for evaluation. The board will then notify him if accepted.

Erb is a nine year veteran at St. John's.

\$112 Thousand Raised Toward New Barracks

The total in the St. John's Diamond Jubilee Fund Drive has passed the \$100,000 mark. To date a total of \$111,798.66 has been given in gifts and pledges over a three-year period.

The drive is being conducted to raise \$300,000 to construct a new 88-Cadet Junior School barracks. Parkview School, which St. John's will acquire at the close of the present school year, will be used for Junior classrooms.

Drive co-chairmen, W. W. Yost and Ham Lynch, Salina businessmen, had hoped the drive would be further along at this point. They have been encouraged by the wonderful support given the school in Salina. Some contributors have delayed making a decision and it is hoped a response will be coming soon.

A total of 506 individuals and firms have given to the drive.

Salina pledges have reached the \$89,186 mark from advance gifts, local gifts and from SJMS personnel.
