A huge shake-up in the Athletic Department at St. John's was revealed this week when Capt. J. D. "Fat" Elmborg announced he was leaving the military school to become ballet coach at Vassar, a prominent Eastern girls' school.

The announcement of Elmborg's leaving was made jointly by Col. R. L. Clem, Rector of St. John's, and Frank Leahy, former football coach at Notre Dame who will become Athletic Director at St. John's.

"Handle Football Chores" Leahy said that he would "handle the football chores formerly handled by Elmborg."

He also said that Dr. Forrest C. "Phog" Allen would join the coaching staff here to direct the Cadet cage team.

Clem pointed out that the shake-up in the athletic staff at St. John's "was to de-emphasize the sports program." He pointed out that "ever since the turn of the century the athletic program has received more and more emphasis and it was time that a trend toward de-emphasis was started."

The Major's comments upon his dismissal were few, but outright. He said, "I think that I am being unjustly treated but I am carrying my case to the Cadet Court and I am in great hopes that they will refuse to accept the decision of the Colonel."
