



Athletic Head Quits Job Here To Take Post At Vassar

A huge shake-up in the Athletic Department at St. John's was revealed this week when Capt. J. D. "Fat" Elmborg announced he was leaving the military school to become ballet coach at Vassar a prominent Eastern girls' school.

The announcement of Elmborg's leaving was made jointly by Col. R. L. Clem, Rector of St. John's, and Frank Leahy, former football coach at Notre Dame who will become Athletic Director at St. John's

"Handle Football Chores" Leahy said that he would "handle the football chores formerly handled by Elmborg."

He also said that Dr. Forrest C.. "Phog" Allen would join the coaching staff here to direct the Cadet cage team.

Clem pointed out that the shake-up in the athletic staff at St. John's "was to de-empha-size the sports program." Maj. R. L. Guernsey, Commandant of Cadets at St. John's for the past eight years was relieved of his command last night for "coddling the seniors".

Col. R. L. Clem issued this statement to the SKIRMISHER late yesterday:

"I wrote Vassar officials and in-cluded the picture of my stu-dent, Conard, and a very lucra-tive contract was received from them by return mail."

Elmborg declined to give de-tails of the contract, but a re-liable informant told the SKIR-MISHER that the former St. John's Athletic Director would receive a "six-figure salary."

Kirk Masline, student at St. John's, has just announced this would be his last year here because he has accepted a contract to teach Fencing at Duke Unilen, two completely unknowns versity.


